Treasurers Report: There have been several returned checks recently. Members are responsible for all fees the club incurs due to checks that are returned. The new Pocock boats have been paid for. There was money needed for supplies to get the donated (new to SLRC) singles dock ready to be installed, so the dock fund line item is now at \$0.00.

Coach's Report: The Jrs. next regatta is the Juniors National Championships which is Friday-Sunday, June 12-14th in Sarasota, Florida. This is selected Varsity rowers only. The Junior's summer season will start on June 17 and run for about 3.5 weeks, ending at the Chicago Sprints (July 11-12). There is also a Jr. Summer LTR with approximately 20 registered. The cost for the Jr. LTR is \$275.

Masters: Still searching for a permanent full-time Intermediate Coach.

Booster Report: There will be a condensed version of the Jrs. Auction this year. Details to come soon. The Jrs. Banquet will be held on Sunday, May 31st, at the Doubletree in Chesterfield.

The Boosters will be buying new tents to replace ones that were damaged.

Communications Report: Need to get confirmed dates for the Summer LTR's. 12 people are registered for the June LTR and already several for the July LTR. The LTR Workshop will be on June 6.

Old Business:

Gordon Hamilton Sculling clinic will be June 19, 20, and 21.

Bank Erosion: Lisa Jones, Jeff Dickler and Deni Dickler met with a rep. to discuss options for our eroding bank. The use of gabion stone was discussed. The County recommended using this stone as did the rep. The cost would be about \$2,500 for the stone. The County has offered the use of its front-loader for this project. WashU will check into the possibility of using some of their equipment as well. The best time to do this will be August, when the lake is at its lowest level. Once the stone is put down the coaches will not be able to pull the launches up to the shore in-between the docks. To solve this, the old singles dock will be moved to the left-side of the docks so that the coaches can pull the launch up there. In order to save what we have left of the shoreline, a no wake zone from the bridge to the shore will be effective immediately.

WashU has plans to install a new dock by the beginning of the fall season. WashU has also raised a concern about safety and security at the boathouse. They are going to look into the cost of surveillance cameras for security. We will also change the combination to the front door keypad yearly.

The poor condition of the locker rooms was raised again. Another email will go out to everyone as a reminder that cleaning schedules must be followed, as well as cleaning up after yourselves when there is a party or if any food is brought to the boathouse.

The Club will pay regatta fees and trailer costs for Juniors Nationals. Also, a season will be raffled off at the Jr. Banquet.

New Business:

We are continuing to work with insurance company regarding the claim for damages due to the storm that occurred at Midwest Junior Rowing Championships (Cincinnati, OH). A surveyor has been out to photograph the damages and estimates are being done to determine what boats will be totaled and what boats can be salvaged.

A reminder will go out to everyone about signing waivers and updating contact info.

An additional ad will be taken out for the sale of the blue trailer.
